

Many Businesses Face a Forest of Paper Faxes

Moreover, a cloud fax solution not only eliminates the need for a dedicated fax phone line, but also saves you the costs of hardware and fax supplies. Businesses can control their costs even more by monitoring individual usage, as the best cloud fax providers offer robust and centralised fax management through an intuitive administrative portal. Finally, productivity often increases because employees no longer have to spend time maintaining machines or waiting endlessly for a paper fax transmission.

Protecting customer privacy within an organization is key, particularly in today's highly regulated environment governed by the UK Data Protection Act of 1998, HSCIC for healthcare organisations, and similar regulations for businesses in other industries. That's why providing employees with their own dedicated fax numbers is one of the other major benefits of cloud faxing. Cloud-based fax transmissions, which with the best providers are encrypted using the most advanced standards, offer unparalleled privacy — whereas traditional faxes often arrive in full view of anyone who happens to be near a fax machine.
